Guildhall Feoffment Community Primary School PE and Sport Premium

Each year the school receives a PE and Sport Grant from the Government. This PE Premium funding provides an excellent opportunity for the school to further improve its PE provision. Although we are restricted in the amount of physical space available and no sports field, PE and sport is very important to us at Guildhall Feoffment. The money from the government has been gratefully received and we have used the money wisely to increase the variety of sports available both inside and outside school hours.

The funding received from PE and sport funding has enabled us:

- To pay for relief cover for PE subject leader to organise and support the teaching of PE and Sport throughout the school
- To work with Bury School Sports Partnership who employ James Sturgeon and take part in an increased number of competitions that he organises
- To increase the subject knowledge of all teaching staff
- To extend the range of extra-curricular sports activities such as tchoukball, tag rugby, football, yoga and orienteering and to ensure all sports clubs are free to all children
- To ensure children have access to appropriate equipment needed for the PE curriculum
- To pay for extra TA support to enable children to travel to local sports facilities in the afternoon so we have the correct pupil/adult ratio
- To ensure that all children are given the opportunity to attend competitions and tournaments
- To provide the children with more opportunities to participate in sport off the school site and use sports facilities away from the school site
- To provide training for Playground Leaders to encourage children to be more active at playtime and lunchtime

Impact of PE and Sport Premium Spending

PE Premium money has been used to continue to fund the sports coordinator for the Bury Schools Partnership. This has been very effective in increasing our participation in inter-school competitions. The competitions are held at least one per month and we have entered at least one team for every sport, apart from netball.

Clubs

Now the new building is complete, we are able to use the Hall for after school clubs. This year we have run several new sports clubs after school free of charge, including yoga, boxercise, gymnastics and dance.

Curriculum

The grant was used to pay for a tag rugby club at the Bury Rugby Grounds, Kwik Cricket on the former St James site, and orienteering at Nowton Park. We have also had a qualified gymnastics coach for one day a week who has been used for CPD in gymnastics for all the staff at school. We have continued to provide extra support staff to help supervise teaching staff when walking to other school sites, such as the former St James School, and the lower school at St Benedicts.

Swimming

Swimming is part of the National Curriculum for PE. All children in KS2 swim during their time in KS2. Currently, 32% of our Y6 children do not possess the swimming requirement expected at the end of KS2.
