What should we know?

Jewish people:

- Say prayers and blessings to God because it reminds them how great God is.
- Say thank you to God for all he provides.
- Have a day of rest each week called Shabbat.
- Pray at both home and the synagogue.
- Sometimes wear special clothes.

Kippah	A head covering for Jews.		Havdalah ceremony	marks the end of Shabbat.
