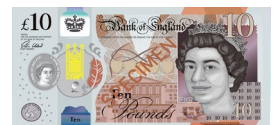

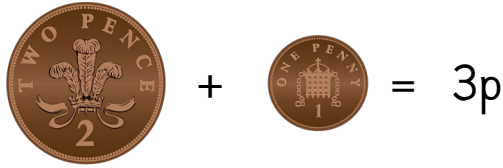

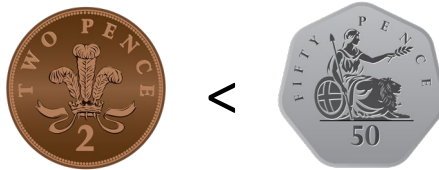


The **total** of 1p and 2p is 3p.

Equal to means the same as.



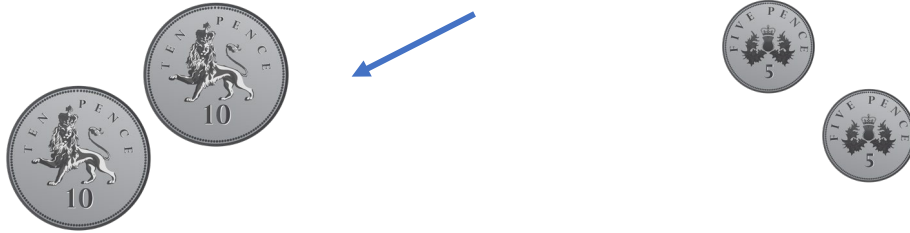
100 pence is **equal to** one pound.
